Futures Waikato Coaching

- ▶ Futures Waikato coaching programs have grown from the initial 3 sessions per term at 3 different golf clubs to 10 sessions at 4 locations:
 - Hamilton Golf Club – 5 Sessions
 - Ngaruawahia Golf Club – 1 Session
 - Te Awamutu Golf Club – 2 Sessions
 - St. Peters School – 2 Sessions
- ▶ 30 Children attended coaching in term one of 2021. Now, we have availability for up to 92 kids to attend coaching in term one of 2023.
- ▶ Coaching sessions have been specifically tailored for kids to get the most out of each session based on age and ability.
- ▶ Term 2 coaching sessions are already filling up and we are looking to add more sessions to accommodate the ever growing needs.




