The 2014/2015 season was the club's 129th season and proved to be a successful one with the club winning the right to play for the Pearce Cup for the first time. This resulted from a very successful one day campaign which saw the Premier team come runners up to Onslow.

History was created during the season, at the AGM in October 2014, when Cheryl Styles was made the first women Life Member of the club, for her service to the club as a scorer and statistician for 32 years.

Once again special congratulations to Luke Ronchi, (who unfortunately didn't get to play a club game this season) who not only played for the Firebirds but went on to represent the Black Caps in ODI's, T20's and eventually a Test match in England where he starred with an exciting 88 on debut. Luke is only the second JCC member to represent New Zealand in a Test match, Eric Fisher being the other one back in 1952. Congratulations also to Luke Woodcock who once again represented the Firebirds with distinction in all three formats of the game and to Rakitha Weerasundara and Scott Mudgway for being selected for Wellington teams. Also congratulations to David Hudson and Hareen Silva for being selected in the Wellington City team.

Congratulations to Michelle Bunkall and Melissa Hansen who represented Central Districts Women and Hannah Lee-Harwood who represented the Wellington U21's.

The Premier side under the leadership of Andrew Stirrat, had an outstanding season coming runners up to Onslow in the Ewen Chatfield One Day Trophy and 5th in the Pearce Cup. Well done to David Hudson for heading the wicket takers and to Rakitha Weerasundara for being the Premier Men's Batsman of the Year.

The Senior Women's team struggled a little with the transfer out of Wellington of Sian Ruck and Thamsyn Newton, but performed much better when Michelle Bunkall returned. Michelle was very fittingly awarded the Greg Carr Trophy as the JCC Cricketer of the year.

It was great to see the former JCC member Leigh Kasperek selected to play for the New Zealand Women's cricket team in their recent series against India.

The club remains one of the strongest in Wellington with 11 Senior Men and Women's teams and 22 junior sides. Let's hope that the interest created by the ICC Cricket World Cup that was held in New Zealand and Australia in February and March leads to renewed interest in our great game by people of all ages, particularly children.

The Club ran a great fundraising and truly enjoyable evening on 4 February 2015 at the 1841 Bar and Restaurant, in the run up to the Cricket World Cup. The format was a panel discussion, getting insights on who was going to do well and not so well at the Cricket World Cup, followed by a Calcutta on the event.

New coach and an overseas professional player

Michael Parlane came on board as Premier Men's coach for the 2014/15 season and UK cricketer Rob Newton joined the team for about half the season.

Along with the momentum from the prior season Hazlett Trophy success, both coach and overseas pro played a big part in getting the team to the one day final and, consequently, vying for the Pearce Cup in the second half of the season.

Michael is back for 2015/16 and we look forward to seeing the results of a full pre-season with the team which he didn't have last season.

Rob won't be back but we are investigating other recruitment options for the upcoming season.

Financials

As detailed in the accompanying financial statements, the club made a loss for the year. Although, as in prior years, when the depreciation charge is backed out, the numbers show a positive result cash flow wise.

The club's cash position remained strong from the high subs collection rate, continued support of sponsors and grant bodies, completion of Cricket Wellington incentive scheme tasks, and continued close monitoring of expenditure.

The bank balance has remained largely unchanged year on year for a wee while now reflecting that the club is generally cash flow neutral each year. It is a challenge each year but adequate revenue is found to continue to fund plenty of new gear as well as development activities such as the Club Development Officer, Coaching Director, and related programs.

The challenge is getting harder each year and we do worry about the continued reliance on grant funding. There will be a number of fundraising activities and / or events planned for the coming year. We know that the extensive JCC community will get behind those activities and events as they have done in prior years.

Thank you to Matthew Judge for again completing the annual audit of the club's financial statements.

One Club

The 2014/15 season was the club's third year as a 'Premier Club' under Cricket Wellington's one club model.

As the Club's Development Officer ('CDO'), Rick Mudgway again completed a variety of development activities within our catchment area as well as specifically for our club members. Rick also completed various administrative tasks for the club. There was a lot of interaction with local primary and intermediate schools with some great feedback received from those schools.

Cricket Wellington and I remain very pleased with Rick's work as CDO. Both Cricket Wellington and the JCC remain committed to the one club program and as such have secured Premier Club status again for the 2015-16 season. We hope to have Rick's services as CDO secured again shortly.

Farewells

Junior Convenor Liza Anderson will be leaving the area toward the end of this calendar year and we will therefore seek nominations and ultimately a replacement to be elected at the upcoming AGM. Prior to departure, Liza has kindly offered to assist the new Junior Convenor to settle in.

We are sad to see Liza go, thank her very much for all her hard work and wish her well for her new endeavour.

I had hoped to be handing over the Chairman role at this AGM but sadly a replacement is yet to be found. Nominations will of course be welcomed at the AGM.

The junior section of the Johnsonville Cricket Club reached registrations of 184 this season, which is down from last season, however there was a lot of interest late in the season.

There were a couple of initiatives that continued on from last season, primarily with coaching assistance and coaching development.

Coaching assistance by members of the Senior Section

The junior section have again had access to coaching from seniors on a regular basis. Most coaches accepted the offer of assistance and were assisted weekly throughout the season. The involvement ranged from one-on-one with players with specific training needs to running team drills. The strong focus was on assisting the coach, not taking over the season. Once again, there has been very positive feedback from all coaches who received assistance.

Police Vetting/First Aid

All coaches were Police vetted for the first time – this was made compulsory for all coaches. There was also a First-aid course offered to coaches, which was well-received. There were representatives from all teams in attendance.

Coaching Courses

All coaches are now strongly encouraged to attend the training courses on offer.

Hawkes Bay

A number of teams again participated in the Hawkes Bay Tournament during January. All grades were represented, excluding Yr 6. There was a mixture of results, however extremely positive feedback was received and the players returned with a lot of enthusiasm for their cricket.

Team Reports

Premier Men

Looking to capitalise on the big strides made in the previous season, we set ourselves the goal of making the Pearce Cup. After many years of searching, we also welcomed Michael Parlane as full-time coach of the Premier squads. While we were unfortunately without the services of stalwart Mark Pulley for this season, through Michael's connections we had Northamptonshire professional Rob Newton join us, and also Sachin Variath from Auckland.

After a quality preseason program organised by Luke Woodcock, we kicked off the one-day campaign against Pearce Cup runners-up from last season Hutt Districts. As would prove to be our winning formula, we batted first and ensured we saw out the 50 overs, posting 214 for 7 including a well-compiled 97 from Luke Woodcock and a brutal 51 from Scott Mudgway batting in the unfamiliar position of number seven. In reply, and in another sign of things to come, David Hudson took four wickets to bowl Hutt Districts out for 106 and secure a confidence boosting first up win.

Following the opening round win, our season hit an early speedbump with a narrow loss to University and a washout against the Wellington Under 19 representative side. Looking to get our season back on track before the tough double-header of Karori and Easts, we were eyeing up a weakened Upper Hutt side. On a good early season grass wicket at the neutral venue of Petone, Sachin and Rob finally got their seasons underway – Sachin with a steady 75 at the top of the order and Rob with a massive 162 off 125 balls. These efforts helped us to post 324 before bowling Upper Hutt out for 148.

With back-to-back games against traditional powerhouses Karori and Easts up next, Mike set us the seemingly optimistic goal of winning at least one of these games to ensure we stayed in the hunt near the halfway stage. First up against Karori, our bowlers put on our trademark squeeze to restrict their dangerous lineup to 222. In reply, we were cruising along at 114 for 1 before losing eight wickets to find ourselves needing four runs off the last over with one wicket in hand. With ice in his veins, Scott Edgecombe stayed calm to loft a drive down the ground and seal a nail-biting win over Karori. Armed with belief now, we were put into bat against Easts and thanks to 83 from Hareen Silva, set them a competitive target of 236. The new look opening bowling duo of Hudson and Stirrat knocked the top off Easts' order, and apart from a scare from the unlikely blade of Ricky Joseph, we bowled Easts out for 194 to cap off a memorable win.

Now sitting at the top of the one-day table, we suffered a heavy T20 loss to Karori and sat through a rained out one-day fixture against the struggling North City before beating Collegians twice in a week; once in a T20 and once in a one-day match, to keep things on the right track. After sweeping aside Petone by nine wickets, we had three consecutive washouts (two T20s and the derby round against

Onslow) before being scheduled to play Taita at the Basin Reserve. With a place in the Pearce Cup confirmed, and the excitement of playing on the famous ground creating a distraction, things unraveled against Taita with a disappointing loss. The only positive to take away being Hudson's five-wicket bag to continue his fine season.

Re-starting again in the New Year, we were up against Naenae with a chance to seal a place in the one-day final. We managed to do so in a close match out at Naenae Park, securing second spot in the Ewen Chatfield Trophy and a finals date against top-qualifiers Onslow at Nairnville Park.

In the lead-up weeks to the one-day final, we thrashed Onslow in a fairly meaningless T20 match, and made our debut in the Pearce Cup with a solid performance against University earning us first innings points.

The big day rolled around, with the winner of the one-day final earning the right to travel to Auckland in April for the National Club Champs. After winning the toss and choosing to bat first on a flat Nairnville pitch, despite fielding a strong batting lineup we were unable to fire, wilting under the hot sun and a good bowling performance from Onslow to be skittled out for 118. Not wanting to give up, David Hudson delivered his best performance to have Onslow 1 for 2, but we never had enough runs and they eventually chased down our total in the 39th over to win by six wickets.

From there, the rest of the Pearce Cup season seemed to peter out thanks to a combination of factors including World Cup absences, injuries (Sachin and Rob both headed home prematurely), some abysmal Wellington weather and a lingering feeling that the job was done in the one-dayers. We batted poorly against Taita to concede first innings points in a drawn match, lost to Easts by ten wickets and were mostly rained out against both Onslow and Karori to end the season in fifth place.

From the heights of beating Karori and Easts to lead the pack prior to Christmas, down to losing the one-day final and dropping off the pace in the Pearce Cup, it was an eventful season and one in which we achieved our goal and exceeded expectations. David Hudson was again invaluable finishing the season with 43 wickets and Rob showed his class with over 500 runs in his abbreviated season. Well done to the team, and let's try to step it up again next season.

After several seasons of great service to the JCC we had to say goodbye to Hareen, who unfortunately for us has headed to Auckland to start a new role. Good luck up there mate.

Our consistency with the bat continually let us down with only Eathorne, McKenzie, Chambers, Brinsdon, Martin and Narayan managing to get past 50 runs at least once throughout the duration of the competition.

Another outright win against Naenae and a draw with Collegians in the two-day competition ensured a 2nd place finish in the Bottom 6 competition, while our plan was to finish top 6, after a horrid start we did get a bit of dignity back with a strong finish to the season. Fourth Grade Bandits

A fired up Bandits squad started their 2014/15 in September with indoor nets under way early in an effort to get ourselves into form for the start of the season proper. The plan appeared to hold some merit as we won our first two one day games with relative ease – by 12 runs and 5 wickets respectively. A third straight win looked on the cards until a fist full of dropped catches and 50 run partnerships for the 9th and 10th wickets took the opportunity away from us. Two more one day losses followed, then after a break for the start of the two day competition we re-found our winning ways with a 6 wicket win in early January. A lifetime later we played our final league one day game at the end of February to suffer a 7 wicket loss. Given the Wellington summer it was rather a surprise to find we'd played all matches with none being rain affected, a 3 win 4 loss record though meant that was as far as we were to go in the competition and placed 6th on the table. This was however a big improvement on last season's 0 win 4 loss effort.

The two day competition started with a shocker, a loss by an innings and 3 runs – failing to get to three figures in either innings. That was followed with a game reduced to a one innings match after the first day was a wash out which brought about a 6 wicket loss. 1 REPORTING ENTITY

These financial statements have been prepared for JOHNSONVILLE CRICKET CLUB INCORPORATED which is an incorporated society registered under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.

2 STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Measurement base

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of earnings and financial position of the Club on a historical cost basis are followed by the Club. Accrual accounting is used to recognise expenses and revenues when they occur.

Specific accounting policies

The following specific accounting policies which materially effect the measurement of the financial performance and financial position have been applied.

Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation to date.

Depreciation

Depreciation has been calculated with reference to the estimated useful life of each asset.

Goods and services tax

The Club is registered for GST, the financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis.

GST due or recoverable at balance date is included in either current liabilities or current assets.

Differential reporting

The entity qualifies for differential reporting as it is not publicly accountable and it meets the size criteria. The Club has taken full advantage of all available differential reporting exemptions.
