Attendance

We value attendance. Kura, along with whaanau are legally responsible for ensuring students attend kura. Just a gentle reminder that late arrivals must report into the Tari.

Uniform

We have a smart uniform that represents our values. We acknowldege piiori that wear this uniform well and with pride. Kids Can provide us with good black school shoes that we issue to piiori that require black shoes. We are well stocked with uniforms and also have in stock warehouse black trackpants.

*Ripped jeans, red bands, gumboots, scuffs and hoodies are not apart of the kura uniform.

Whaanau when your child is telling you that every one is wearing the above, think of what we are doing to manage this. No there is only a handful who continually think it's okay to not abide by the rules. Are impossible for me


I cannot build a mountain

We started the week with a goal setting exercise where our aim was to complete as many standards as possible. The year 12 and 13 cohort started with Physical Education and History. 






Mangapuu - Home Economics

- 9. If you don't have internet access, the school office staff can provide you with printed copies of the policy and review form.

Learning Support

At Te Wharekura o Maniapoto, we value an **inclusive** culture where students are valued and respected. All students have the opportunity to achieve their potential, and to participate in school life with their peers.

Learning Support Needs

Every student has the right to achieve success and make progress at school, regardless of their ability. Every student needing learning support also has the right to assistance to reach their potential.

The Learning Support Action Plan 2019-2025 sets out priority actions that help ensure children and young people get the right support, at the right time. Learning should be a positive experience for every young person, including those with learning support needs.

Students who need learning support include:

- neurodiverse learners and learners with disabilities, learning difficulties, communication or behaviour difficulties, and/or sensory or physical impairments
- gifted learners
- English language learners (ELL)
- those who are not achieving, or at risk of not achieving
- those at risk of disengaging.

Students may be identified as needing learning support through a variety of means - see **Identify Learning**Support

Organising Learning Support

Services work collaboratively within the Learning Support Delivery Model (LSDM) to organise learning support. Support may be provided from a range of sources - see the Ministry of Education's comprehensive list of available supports for students with **learning support needs**. Resources provided may include therapy, staffing, equipment and other materials, and property modification and transport, as well as advice and specialist support (Ministry's Inclusive Education Policy). Parents/caregivers are included in decisions regarding the best approach to support the student's learning needs.

A Special Needs Management Committee meets monthly or fortnightly, as required, to budget, prioritise, and allocate resources, and to monitor the progress of students. It comprises Hirere Moana, the lead special needs coordinator, and Liane Green, the kaiako special needs.

Providing Learning Support

Some students with significant educational needs are regarded as having ongoing learning support needs, and their extra support is funded through the Ongoing Resourcing Schemes (ORS). See **Ongoing Resourcing Schemes** (Ministry of Education) for more information, including eligibility criteria.

The Learning Support Action Plan prioritises a wide range of support for children and young people with moderate learning support needs, who are not eligible for ORS funding. The Special Education Grant (SEG) funds the support of other children regarded as needing extra support at school. Support may include extra teacher or teacher aide time, literacy support, or other resources and learning programmes. Resourcing for staffing and support is included in the annual budgeting process. The school works within its funding constraints and annual budgets, prioritising all additional learning needs professionally and carefully.

Teachers plan programmes and strategies to cater for the individual needs of the students in their class. Teachers and **support staff** who are responsible for students needing learning support may receive relevant professional development.

When a student's needs are identified as ongoing, or the school deems it appropriate for a student, an **individual education plan** is developed. This process involves parents, teachers, and other support agencies as appropriate.
