CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

At this stage last year, we were describing the 2017/18 year as a significant milestone for HBCA with the approval of our 4-year Strategic Plan: Game Development, Financial Success, Leadership & Communication, and High Performance. This past year has been about taking the 4 pillars of the strategic plan and transforming it in progress.

Progress on each pillar is moving steadily forward. For the 2018/19 season NZC have established 5 Key Performance Indicators which must be met to receive our full allocation of NZC funding. These KPIs will have a significant impact on Game Development. The most significant changes will be the full adoption of the Age & Stage based game whereby all school teams across the country will be playing to a consistent set of rules. Some ages will be more affected than others. Due to the commercial significance of the HBCA cricket camps we have decided to ring-fence this tournament from the Age & Stage format and will undertake a survey at the completion of the tournament to ensure HBCA are offering an experience the players want. Strengthening the woman's game across all ages will be another key focus. As part of this we are hopeful of 2 females joining the Board in a bid to provide much needed diversity.

Financial: Gaming Grant revenue was significantly down on previous years. This, combined with a new staff structure, meant we needed to monitor expenditure carefully. It is pleasing to report a break even result. Gaming grant revenue can vary significantly from year to year. We work closely with the Trusts sharing the Association's, so we are hopeful this will return to normal levels in 2018/19. This presents an opportunity to thank the Trusts and all our sponsors whose generous support ensures HBCA can deliver the game as effectively as we can.

High Performance: The 2017/18 year could be described as solid year for all our representative teams. The men's team retained the Chapple Cup and the U13 girls and U17 boys were both successful in winning their respective tournaments. The High-Performance program under Craig Ross is in full swing. The players have been working hard during the winter months and we are confident this will be reflected in strong performances on the park.

The 2018/19 season will mark the 40th anniversary of the HBCA cricket camps - still often referred to as the Riverbend camps. The camp is the jewel in HBCA's crown. They continue to go from strength to strength, providing the players with an opportunity to hone their cricketing skills over a concentrated period. As an Association it also provides us with much needed financial resource. This is an opportunity to acknowledge the vision and hard work of Ray Mettrick and our President Harry Findlay all those years ago. This year Ray's efforts were recognised by him receiving the Queens Service Medal for services to cricket. 40 years on it is still pleasing to see Ray and Harry heavily involved with the Camps.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the staff at HBCA. They are a small but dedicated team led by our CEO - Craig Findlay. This coming season will be extremely busy; however, I am confident they will be equal to the challenge.

Lastly, a strong vote of gratitude goes to wider HBCA community for your contribution to the game. I wish you all a successful 2018/19 season.

CEO REPORT

The 2017-18 season saw the introduction of our new Strategic Plan and our **Vision** to be the leading District Cricket Association in New Zealand and **Mission** to foster, support and grow participation for the game throughout our district was at the forefront of what we implemented throughout the season. Our focus was on our four key pillars; Game Development, Financial Success, Leadership and Communication, and High Performance.

Game Development

Kilbirnie Sports T20 Tournament

After the washout in 2016/17 we were hoping for better weather and this came to fruition. We did however only have 14 teams enter, which was a couple down on the 16 required to run the tournament as we'd like to. We were able to enter a HB team of High School players who were joined by Bevan Small and Dane Cleaver and this was a great success. The Final was contested between Central HB and Onslow and should have turned out to be a close match, however rain early in the first innings meant that the match was abandoned, and the Championship was shared.



Cricket Camps

There continued to be growth for the annual Hawke's Bay Cricket Camps and again provided teams all over the North Island with cricket throughout January. We had a record number of 147 teams attending, with 31 (31 last year) from Hawke's Bay, 50 (40) from Wellington, 34 (36) from Northern Districts, 11 (9) from Auckland and 21 (18) from other Central Districts regions. The accommodation and catering provided by Riverbend Church and Napier Boys' High School was again high quality and teams love coming to Hawke's Bay to play on our wonderful grounds.



The Association also ran tournaments during Labour weekend, these proved very popular with 33 (38 last year) teams involved, 23 of which came from outside our region.

It will be a huge year in 2019 celebrating 40 years.

Club Competitions

Napier Tech Old Boys won the overall Premier Grade Championship for a record 6th year in a row and the 55 over competition. Havelock North won the 50 competition and Central HB won the T20 Championship. Property Brokers were our Major Sponsor of this Grade and their support is very much appreciated.

The National Club Knock Out Final was again won by Napier Tech who then went on to Palmerston North and won through to the National Club Championships after victories over the Taranaki and Manawatu Champions. They then went on to represent Hawke's Bay and Central Districts in Auckland. After five frustrating days of cricket with 3 matches abandoned due to wet weather they only just qualified for the final which they convincingly won over Wellington Club, Onslow, giving them their 2nd National Title.



Division 1 was structured with three formats. The main competition was played over a twelve-week period when our University Students were back. Eleven teams played a 45 over Round Robin competition with Napier Boys' High winning a thrilling, low scoring final over Lindisfarne.

The Division 2 Championship was won by Napier Pirates, and Division 3 saw Cornwall win before Christmas and Havelock North after Christmas.

Development Programmes

Dale Smidt continue to drive our development programmes and has done a great job with his summer squad coaches, providing Sport Skills in Schools programmes, which is funded through Kiwi Sport and our very successful user pays Holiday Programmes. Dales report outlines many more areas that the Association have provided our cricket community.



Womens Cricket

Bob Morgan continues to take womens cricket ahead and works extremely well in providing many programmes and opportunities for all levels. There is a full report on Womens Cricket later in this report. Bob was also the Hawke's Bay Women's coach.

Umpires

Our Hawke's Bay Umpires and Scorers Association continue to provide our Premier cricketers with some of the best quality in the country. We are always on the lookout for new umpires and rely on the clubs and schools to ask their members to become involved in this most important role in cricket.

Financial Success

The Association had a surplus of just under \$200, which after staff changes and lower than budgeted gaming grant income ended up being a good result. We implemented a new Accounting Software package in XERO and restructured our Board reporting package. Rachel Weeks was contracted on a part time basis helping with the accounts.

A massive thanks to our Sponsors and the Gaming Trusts, without your support we would struggle to effectively run the association.

Leadership and Communication

Our Delivery Agreements are a key area for our Premier clubs and are an important component to successfully running a club. Four of our Clubs have been able to implement nearly all of these initiatives, however for the continued success of our Club Competitions we need to continue to assist all clubs and a key area is junior development and with the New Age/Stage Formats being fully introduced in 2018/19, we are hoping for increased junior playing numbers which should benefit club playing numbers. Our first ever Club Conference was held in July, which was attended by over 40 people and we were able to outline what NZC are planning for cricket throughout the country and its future direction.

Facebook continues to be our main method of communication and our followers increased to nearly 1500 people and, in some cases, posts received over 5000 views. We will continue to develop in the Social media area as this seems to be the most effective way of communicating with our Community. We were able to get more Media coverage from HB Today through results provided through CricHQ and with the continued development and increased scoring through the CricHQ scoring APP, it's hoped that results from all competition will be able to be supplied to the newspaper, so the public have this option as a way of knowing what's happening with cricket in the Bay.

Our Governance Board continue to provide great direction and have formed sub Committees which enables us to operate very effectively.

High Performance

The area of High Performance was the biggest area of change for the Association, with the employment of Craig Ross to manage this area. His influence, knowledge and skillset has seen an immediate impact on our programmes and the adoption of a High-Performance Plan and Selection Policy has given a very clear direction on what we want to achieve in Hawke's Bay.

Our representative teams continue to perform well, and several players have gone on to represent Central Districts and New Zealand. Craig has provided a detailed report on the High-Performance area.



Looking ahead to 2018-19

Over the last few months we have formed a Partnership Agreement with Central Districts Cricket and New Zealand Cricket and there are some Key Performance Areas which will form a lot of what we will be aiming to achieve this season.

1. Age & Stage – Implementing New Zealand Cricket new formats and pitch lengths.
2. National Coaching Framework – Nationwide implementation of NZC 'coach qualification' policy (a suitably 'qualified' coach for all junior and youth club teams, creating a coaching family network within 'Friendly Manager', supported by NZC, MA and DA coach developers).
3. Inclusion/Diversity – Increasing strategic and operational focus by NZC, MAs and DAs on the development and delivery of 'inclusion and diversity' programmes, with primary focus still being on continued strengthening of the base of female participation, including governance of our organisations.
4. Digital Platform – National acceptance and adoption of our preferred single modern platform servicing grassroots cricket - CricHQ
5. Capability – Increasing strategic and operational focus by NZC, MAs and DAs on the development and delivery of capability support within our own organisations as well as within clubs and schools

Thanks to the HBCA Board for their leadership and direction and support throughout the year. Thanks to Bob, Craig and Dale for their efforts during the season. I look forward to another great year of cricket in the BAY and working with Clubs and Schools to increase playing numbers and make us the leading District Cricket Association in New Zealand.

HIGH PERFORMANCE OPERATIONS MANAGER REPORT

The first year of this new role was busy with leading and assessing the development of players and coaches at Hawke's Bay rep level and becoming familiar with the secondary school structure in Hawke's Bay.

Pay Excellence Senior Men

The season started well with the winning of the Chapple Cup and Kirk Cup, and convincing victories against Bay of Plenty in two T20 matches in Tauranga.

The timing of the Chapple Cup provided another opportunity for our professional Central Stags players to join our core group of players. The retention of the Cup was achieved by the discipline of our bowling and fielding unit, and some significant individual batting performances.

These games led into the newly re-vamped Furlong Cup competition. The inclusion of first innings bonus points for the 2017-18 season provided a new challenge for the Pay Excellence Senior team.



In four of the five games we were asked to bat first in challenging conditions and our top order led by Jake Smith excelled in averaging 364 runs per first innings and collecting all but one of the bonus points on offer. Ben Stoyanoff led our bowling attack admirably with pace and accuracy but overall our bowling & fielding couldn't convert the opportunities presented to claim the points on offer and ultimately win the Furlong Cup. These learnings will benefit the team moving forward as they now prepare for the 2018-19 season.

Angus Schaw and Liam Rukuwai continued their significant contribution to the Senior Men's team each playing their 50th game during the 2017-18 season.

Hawke's Bay Mavericks

Eight fixtures were scheduled for the 2017-18 season for the newly named Emerging Players team. This schedule included an internal Napier v Hastings one-day game.

Pre-Xmas the Mavericks team was selected with a blend of youth and experience in mind and then post Xmas more senior players were included. The success of the program was not only measured by the games we won but by the freedom it gave our players to use their skills on the park and develop confidence through this approach.

The final record of played 6, won 3, lost 2, abandoned 1 was a positive result, including of note, wins over BOP 2nd XI and Northern Maori. The team was well led on numerous occasions by Jayden Lennox with consistency in our bowling & fielding, and in our batting that achieved some significant individual performances. Dominic Thompson's match winning 122* against BOP and overall Harry Young's 225 runs for the season were batting highlights.

Age Group Boy Representative Teams

Once again, we selected four Junior Boys age group teams to represent us at two CD tournaments and a range of post Xmas games.

The Almak Fire & Security Hawke's Bay U/17 team finished 1st equal at their CD tournament and there were some outstanding individual performances throughout including William Clark's dynamic 114 v Horowhenua-Kapiti. The Complete Paints U/15 team had a tough week finishing in the bottom half of their tournament in Levin, but there was lots of good learning and this experience will not hinder any of these players future performances in the 'black & white'.

Our U/13 & U/14 teams played up to 4 fixtures each in the Post-Xmas period, which unfortunately was rain-affected, and some fixtures were cancelled due to Districts not having teams to play against. There were many successes for these teams and in viewing games I can confirm there are plenty of quality young players coming through our ranks.

High Performance Programs

The boys pre-season Academy & Skills program commenced in the first two weeks of August 2017 and utilised seven specialist coaches to deliver weekly sessions over an 8-week period. A structure was set for the 58 players involved in each skill-set prior to August and the coaches followed these outcomes at the appointed times. Fielding sessions and an S&C presentation were also held.

I was really impressed with the learning environments created and the level of engagement from the players and parents alike from this. The pleasing aspect for me was the way the players thereafter applied their skills they learned. An example of this was watching the Academy team win three out of four T20 games in the Kilbirnie Sports T20 tournament in late September.

The pre-season girls & women's program commenced a month later than the boys and ran with the same structure until early November. Once again, the 10



players involved engaged to a high level and some new ideas on skills were explored. Some of these will take time to adapt when playing but persistence will bring better outcomes long term.

High Performance Coaches

There were over twelve different Hawke's Bay coaches involved in our HP skills & rep playing program over the last 12 months. They covered cricket specific skills, team coaching, strength & conditioning and team management duties. I thank all of them for their many countless hours of work and expertise they showed in their respective roles.

The HBCA coach club held six events in this period which focused on best practice for cricket skills and various presentations on the art of coaching. Attendance numbers have been good for each event and our database of twenty Coach Club coaches is growing.

Hawke's Bay coaches who attended the CD Level 1 & Level 2 run courses over the last year were:

Level 1: (4) Dean Foxcroft (Taradale CC), Derek Martin, Mark Watson, Rob Hay (Lindisfarne)

New Zealand Cricket's new coach database and on-line portal will bring quality structure to the coach learning pathway for all coaches. HBCA will be running practical coaching courses and establishing coach developer networks to align to this resource.

Secondary Schools Boys

31 boys' teams entered our HB competitions this season. The new initiative of mid-week T20 cricket was very well received by many of these teams with traditional 1st & 2nd XI teams still playing in the men's Saturday club competitions. The 1st XI and Yr. 9 & 10 (Colts) team National Knock-out competitions involved some excellent cricket and hard-fought contests. Hastings Boys HS defeated Napier BHS in the Hawke' Bay 1st XI final and represented us in Palmerston North at the CD qualifier tournament. Hastings BHS also qualified to represent Hawke's Bay in the Year 9 & 10 CD qualifier competition.



And it was pleasing to see four different 1st XI teams win competitions this season. Lindisfarne (T20 Div. 1), Napier BHS (RC MacInnes Div. 1 - 45 over), Hastings BHS (1st XI CD HB Regional winner), and St Johns College (45 over end-of-season Div. 1).

A high level of engagement with Secondary Schools in 2018-19 will focus on further identifying talent and coach development opportunities, offer initiatives that will increase participation, and continue club's interaction with our schools so leaving players link to clubs for their senior cricket.

DEVELOPMENT MANAGERS REPORT

School Holiday Programs – 44 players (aged 9-13) attended over 2 two day programs during the October school holidays and a further 15 in a 3 day program prior to Christmas. Generates good revenue for the association and provided work for coaches Senarathne and Pretorius. One young lad described it as the best 3 days of his life. Players pay \$40 a day to attend.



Hooked on Cricket – Provided assistance to NZCPA in this community program. 6 schools attended the festival cricket day (28th Feb) and received coaching and played games. Lunch and giveaways also provided. Delivered by the CD Stags with several current or former **Blackcaps** in attendance.

Sport Skills in Schools – Funded through NZ Sport and delivered via Sport HB, we received \$14 K to run this program over the summer. Schools visited were – Wairoa College / Port Ahuriri / Te Awa / Argyll East / Porongahau / Westmount / Onekawa / Elsthorpe / Pukehamoamoa / and St Matthews. In total 912 year 5-8 students received 5 sessions which included coaching on catching, throwing, striking, bowling with a festival game day on the last visit. Coaches that assisted me to deliver the program were – Indika Senarathne, Luke Kenworthy, Dominic Thompson, GC Prisorius, Dean Foxcroft and Matt Edmondson. Sessions are regularly monitored by Sport HB staff. Coaches were all very good ambassadors for HB Cricket and feedback from all participating schools was excellent.

Age and Stage - First year of a 2 year plan to adopt the changes as set down by NZC. Implemented in all primary school Saturday morning fixtures. Little or no opposition to reduced playing numbers, smaller pitches and proper boundaries. General feedback is that there is more involvement for players, and teams are having more fun and better games. No major adverse effect on playing numbers with 116 entries being 4 less than last year. Phase 2 for all Intermediate age cricketers will happen this summer, playing conditions have been re written and sent out. We are expecting some negative feedback but all parties have had significant notice of the forth coming changes.



Superstar Cricket – Formerly known as the “Have a Go” program. 102 registered participants with a further 80 unofficial participants as well. Programs delivered by Napier Tech, Cornwall, Central and Taradale cricket clubs. Also at Te Mata, Havelock and Maraekakaho schools.

Super League and Junior Rep Cricket – The Super League competitions were run over the Month of November culminating in Napier v Hastings fixtures played in early December. This was an excellent day with 3 close games played at Frimley Park well supported by parents and played in good spirit with some very good cricketers on display. Mandatory 10 overs of spin introduced to Super League to increase our player pool and provide more opportunities for these players. Trials held and a year 8 team selected to compete in North Island tournament as part of Riverbend Camps. This team won this tournament easily, with some outstanding individual performances and reinforced the value of the junior club competition and Napier / Hastings fixtures and also the quality of the coaching some of these players have been receiving.



Other Junior cricket – Year 4 and 5s played over 2 Sundays in December in a mini tournament involving teams from Gisborne and Taupo. Thanks to life member Ray Mettrick for putting this together. Labour weekend and Riverbend camps added, there is massive opportunities to play cricket in HB for juniors in great weather and at good facilities.

Coaching – Assisted Craig Ross with winter high performance program and as assistant coach with HB under 17s. Coached year 8s in North Island tournament and umpired at all levels to assist with match management and view players re selection.

Additional Schools – helped out at Napier Central and Nelson Park schools with their cricket programs and also ran extra sessions at Westmount School on a user pays basis.

Coach Education – attended seminars around the Coach Developer program being rolled out by Sport NZ and locally Sport HB. Still in its infancy but will become a key part of coaching at all levels going forward. Massive changes in the whole coaching area going forward. Coaching a team course poorly attended after 2 excellent turnouts prior. Surveyed parents indicate there is a high demand for coaching of Coaches. Getting them to courses is another matter and a work on to find a suitable solution.

Tournaments and Festival Days. – planned festival days were unfortunately washed out at the end of March. NZ knock cup for intermediate schools ran as a festival – 6 entries – incorporated changes to 9 a side, shorter pitch and used an orange ball. Excellent day with lots of fun and some exciting close games.

WOMEN'S REPORT

Primary & Intermediate School Girls:

This season we selected an under 13 girls' team. This team participated in the North Island Development tournament in Masterton. This gave a lot of girls their first experience at girls only hard ball cricket. The team was very successful winning the tournament after being runners up last season. John Wakefield was assistant coach with Keita Russell as Manager.

Moving forward we are having some preseason training for this age group starting in September based at Woodford House.

Secondary Schools:

Entries increased again this season as did playing numbers. The competition is an 8-a-side T/20 competition. Napier Girls High School is representing Hawkes Bay at the Central Districts tournament.

Club Programme:

The focus at this level needs to be participation and active encouragement of the development of players. This season we saw the teams endorse this participation philosophy. We are actively trying to impress on the club hierarchies the change of focus and need for it on the club game.

The Club competition has a social focus and is played over a 6-9 week period on Friday nights.

This allows the more serious players to play their serious cricket on a Saturday for men's teams while giving opportunities to those not good enough to play in a men's team to still play the game.

Super City Programme:

We established a new Super City competition aimed at players who are not current Hinds players to provide a level of competition below the rep level allowing a more serious Women's competition to be run and providing a clear player pathway.

This was based over 6 weeks of the season. The teams involved were Gisborne, Hastings and Palmerston North. In the 2018/19 season we are looking at putting together an Under 15 competition to run alongside it.

HB Representative Teams:

Hawkes Bay had the following female representative teams this season:

- HB Senior Women
- HB Under 18's
- HB Under 15's
- HB Under 13's

All HB senior women's practices were open to any female cricketer to attend no matter what age or ability. This has proven a success for our representative teams with younger players being able to step up to the next level because they have the confidence knowing the players they will be playing with. The fact they train with Hinds players also helps with confidence.

Results were mixed with the Senior women only managing to win 1 game of 4.

HB Under 18's Wanganui tournament was rain affected however a couple of good stand out individual achievements were noted.

HB Under 15's tournament was also adversely affected by weather. The team made up of a large number of Under 13 players showed spirit and nearly upset Wellington who sent their Under 18 team!

HB Under 13's Won in Masterton while the Cornwall team performed extremely well at Riverbend Camp.

High Performance Programme:

With the arrival of Craig Ross, we have identified key players that are receiving ongoing specialised training. We should start to see the benefits of this in the 2018/19 season.

2018/19 Planning:

We are in contact with schools and are hopeful that we are going to have another increase in playing numbers with some new initiatives we are looking at implementing.

Clubs that attended the conference recently had a presentation of our plan for women's cricket moving forward. This was well received, and we are confident that we may be having an increase in participation at that level also.

Sean Davies has accepted the role of HB Women's Coach. I will continue as manager this season and will continue to coach the age group rep teams. We have identified some other interested coaches that we will be developing to assist in the future.

From the Past Twenty-Five Years Ago

The Premier teams had lost 11 playing days out of a possible 25 during the previous season so it was pleasing to note that there was only one playing day lost last season.

The Association welcomed five teams from Central Hawke's who had been granted dispensation from Southern Hawke's Bay to play in our competitions.

The Management Committee with new members David Black, Jackie Gardiner and Des Morrison met 15 times during the year to ensure that the Association's affairs were run as smoothly as possible.

The end of season prize giving function was held in the Napier Red Cross Hall with the support from one of our major sponsors the "Tennyson Motor Inn".

The aim to replace the old pavilion has been a long drawn out affair, Over the last few years there have been many negotiations, and counter negotiations, until eventually in July this year we were able to give the "green" light for construction to begin.

Treasurer, David Pearson, advised that the Association only recorded a surplus of \$446.00 for the 1993/94 season. The total income for the year was \$59,795.00 with affiliation fees bringing in \$47,616.00. This accounted for 79% of total income. Apart from affiliation fees the main source of income was the revenue generated by the representative matches (\$2,108), Sponsorship and Grants (\$3,306), Indoor Centre (\$1,626) and the Booklet (\$1,667). The decrease in revenue from first class and international matches is of concern as it directly impacts on the Association's overall result. Ground Fees (\$15,592 being 26%), Representative matches (\$13,670 being 23%) and Salary and expenses (\$15,654 being 26%) contributed to the major expenses of the association.

New Zealand played India in a one-day match on the 25th March. The game resulted in a win to New Zealand, the seventh consecutive victory by our national team at McLean Park. Danny Morrison took a hat trick.

An Emerging Players XI played Pakistan in a four-day game from the 4th to 7th February.

We hosted the New Zealand Under 20 Tournament in Hastings and the New Zealand Youth Under 18 Tournament in Napier.

Peter Pinfold was appointed as sole selector with Brian Barbour as manager of the senior team. The team started off the season well by winning the Chapple Cup in the tournament held at Wanganui in Labour Weekend. They failed to qualify in the first round for a Ubix Challenge but won all three games in the bottom section, beating Horowhenua-Kapiti on the first innings and getting outright wins against Wairarapa and Southern Hawke's Bay.

Campbell Furlong and Shayne O'Connor were selected in the New Zealand Youth Team that travelled to Pakistan. Hawke's Bay players again provided a solid nucleus in the Central Districts' side with Stuart Duff, Mike Pawson, David Blake and Alistair Alcock making the Shell Cup and Shell Trophy Teams.

29 clubs entered a total of 51 teams to play competition cricket during the season.

Napier Technical Old Boys Cricket Club won the Premier competition. The reorganized Senior competition saw Taradale win Section One, Waipukurau win Section Two and Taradale High School win Section Three. The Presidents Grade was won by Waipukurau, with NOBM winning the Third Grade and Terminus Inn winning the Fourth Grade. Napier Old Boys Marist won the Women's Grade. The L D Carter Memorial Trophy for the club winning the most points in all grades was won by the Napier Technical Old Boys Cricket Club.

Stuart Duff won the Villiers Cup having the highest batting average. The MJF Shrimpton Cup for scoring most runs was won by Jason Pawley. The Fulton Cup for scoring the fastest century was awarded to Darryl Morgan. Roger Fouhy took the most wickets and collected the Barry Mason Memorial Cup. Peter Worley won the Hanlon Cup for having the best bowling average.

Technical was judged the best premier fielding side winning the Maurice Jeffery Memorial Cup with Wade Pahi collecting the Alan Beck Memorial Cup as the outstanding fielder in the premier competition.

Jason Pawley was acknowledged as the most promising Under 23 player and received the Budge Grant Memorial Trophy, Shayne O'Connor was awarded the Ranford Bat as the most promising Under 21 player and Kirk Wotherspoon won the Billy Hughes Trophy as the most outstanding secondary schoolboy.

Following the directions set by New Zealand Cricket our women's teams will now be included under the administration of the Hawke's Bay Cricket Association. The Hawke's Bay Women's team succeeded in retaining the Coplin Trophy, symbol of supremacy for the district associations in Central Districts. Cath Atkins (capt), Julia James, Emma Jensen, Mel Leach, Tisa Mativa, Rebecca Rolls and Megan Graham all represented Central Districts at 1st XI status. Rebecca Rolls was rewarded with selection to the National U23 team that toured to Australia.

The Junior Cricket Board with new Chairman, David Morris, continued to provide the opportunity for the age group squads to play against several representative teams.

Thirty-five senior secondary school students attended a Level 1 coaching course.

The HB Junior Board tabled a balance sheet that showed an income of \$19,681.31

1 Statement of Accounting Policies

Statement of Compliance and Basis of Preparation

Hawke's Bay Cricket Association Incorporated is eligible to apply Tier 3 PBE Accounting Standards : PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit), on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses of equal to or less than \$2,000,000. The incorporated society has elected to report in accordance with PBE SFR-A (NFP). All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting.

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of the Statement of Financial Performance and Statement of Financial Position on a historical cost basis are followed by the incorporated society, unless otherwise stated in the Specific Accounting Policies.

The information is presented in New Zealand dollars. All values are rounded to the nearest \$.

The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

Specific Accounting Policies

The following specific accounting policies which materially affect the measurement of the Statement of Financial Performance and Statement of Financial Position have been applied:

(a) Revenue Recognition

Interest received is recognised as interest accrues, gross of refundable tax credits received.

Dividends received are recognised on receipt, net of non-refundable tax credits.

Grants and sponsorship income is recognised in the statement of financial performance when it is received unless there are conditions attached to the grant, in which case the revenue is recognised once the conditions of the grant are met.

Fees, subscriptions and other revenue from members are recognised in the season they relate to. All other revenue is recognised at the time the goods or services are delivered.

(b) Inventories

Inventories are recognised at lower of cost and net realisable value, determined on a first-in first-out basis.

(c) Trade Receivables

Trade Receivables are recognised at estimated realisable value.

(d) Property, Plant & Equipment (refer to Depreciation Schedule)

Property, plant and equipment are valued at cost less aggregate depreciation.

(e) Income Tax

The entity is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

(f) Investments

Investments in listed companies are stated at valuation. Other non-current investments are stated at cost.

Notes to and forming part of the Performance Report (continued)

For the Year Ended 31 July 2018

(g) Goods and Services Taxation (GST)

Revenue and expenses have been recognised in the performance report exclusive of GST except that irrecoverable GST input tax has been recognised in association with the expense to which it relates. All items in the Statement of Financial Position are stated exclusive of GST except for receivables and payables which are stated inclusive of GST. The incorporated society is registered for GST.

(h) Bank Accounts & Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

(i) Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on a basis consistent with the previous year.
