A WORD FROM THE PRESIDENT



As we wind down our season I am appreciative of yet another successful year. Having stepped into the role at our last AGM I am pleased at the progress that we have made as a province despite the many challenges that we have faced.

I have also been fortunate enough to have been joined by an amazing committee who have moved heaven and earth to ensure that our association continues to provide for the community. We also welcomed a new Secretary and Vice President and bid farewell to our past President Kuini Thompson. Her presence in our province has been sorely missed.

With the implementation of the Touch NZ junior policy, we had a lot of work to do to ensure that we provided a programme that ticked all the boxes. After much consultation with the Waikato Touch community and a handful of our coaches we were able to develop a programme that met the needs of our participants. Although it wasn't without the usual challenges, we look forward to ironing out the kinks for further programmes.

Part of this programme involved the addition of Touch PALS where we utilised our Youth players to assist with coaching and mentoring the junior players through skills development. The kids really enjoyed having these players involved and the Touch PALS thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to give back to our province.

We were fortunate enough to have 17 teams (U10s-U14s) this year and look to capitalise on this and increase our participation numbers yet again next season.

With the new junior policy came the disestablishment of the IPS structure and in its place Auckland Touch offered the "Tamariki Touch Classic". I congratulate the Tamariki Touch committee on running and excellent tournament for our teams. The ability to be offered some form of tournament to finish the junior season was greatly appreciated. Waikato were fortunate to walk away with some taonga including the 14 Boys Division 1 plaque, the 14 Boys Division 2 runners up placing and the 14 Girls Division 2 runners up placing. Well renowned coach Shane Edwards was awarded the Kaupapa Award which acknowledged Shane's support and spirit adopting the Tamariki Touch Classic Kaupapa. A much-deserved award.

Due to COVID still being prevalent in our community we had to make a hard decision to centralise our junior modules. We felt that by centralising our modules we were able to still provide some form of play in Alert level 2. We are still in the process of catering for all needs however aren't sure whether this will happen in time for our next season.

We had a very successful Youth Nationals campaign. We were fortunate enough to send 9 teams (including 3 development teams) to the Youth Nationals. All of which performed greatly. We had no teams finish last and had 4 out of our 9 teams finish in the top 3. Two of our teams winning Gold medals – U16 Boys Red and U18 Girls Red, congrtulation to these teams and management. We had a significant number of players selected for the U16 teams and also the Talent ID Camp and a large amount selected for the U18 teams who will compete at the Youth Trans-Tasman in Christchurch early next year.

With COVID again causing an upset our Nationals held in Christchurch were postponed which meant the new date was set 6 weeks post original date. We commend Touch NZ for allowing provinces to have their say on the re-formatting of the tournament and also still allowing it to go ahead. This was no doubt a logistical nightmare for all involved however everyone managed to get it all sorted. This also meant that the master's programme was pushed out and also the Homegrown Series which was to provide another avenue for elite level of play was cancelled. Thank you to our Open/Masters teams for all the extra work you had to endure due to the change of date. It was exciting to see the end results of all our teams who all did amazing with our Open men's team winning Gold.

We are also glad to announce the renewal of our contract with SAS Sports Ltd, we have been happy with the work conducted by them to allow us an opportunity to partner with them again. They've gone above and beyond to meet our demands and continue to do so. We value our relationship being able to continue into future years.

Again, we wouldn't have been able to do half of what we do without our volunteers. From our coaches, managers, referees and committee members, we are grateful to have such a passionate bunch of people steering our progress to our final destination.

We have a few projects in the pipeline as we strive to meet our goals including Referee development where we look to having all Youth players complete a TMRC course. We will also be targeting parents and school teachers to get involved by completing the TMRC Course.

We are also looking to establish an Intermediate Tournament and also look to re-establish the Secondary Schools tournament.

We also look forward to working more in the community space and giving back by running an annual "charity match". With the support of SAS Sports Ltd we look forward to stepping into this space building vital relationships as we go. We have set some targets to increase the participation rates of our sport by 15%, a challenge but we feel an achievable target.

With the newly signed SAS Contract we are looking for a new design for our playing uniforms which will also incorporate our 30 year Waikato Touch anniversary. Exciting times ahead.

Lastly, I would like to acknowledge the previous Presidents of Waikato Touch, over my short time in this role I have realised there are many long hours of work along with challenges with this role. I want to acknowledge you all for giving your time to our sport, thank you for leading the way for Waikato Touch association to ensure we grow and continue to provide for our Touch community. A lot of the success we saw this last season is due to the foundation you have all set up during your time as WTA president.

COACHES REPORT

This Year was a challenging one for our province, with covid 19 being a constant threat we were faced with the prospect of numerous disruptions to both our modules and our tournaments, but despite a couple of hiccups we managed to finish our season albeit a little late.

There was also a major change to our junior programme with the cancellation of the IPS tournament and a shift to a less competitive but more inclusive structure to our programme, this aligned us to the requirements of the National body, it also resulted in more junior teams. These teams required coaches and I want to thank all the new coaches that came on board this year.

This change meant that the way we ran our programme for our juniors became known as "carnival days" which were run over three weekends. These carnival days consisted of skills development sessions followed by a tournament style structure where kids were playing 3–4 games where they could implement their newly learnt skills. This was only possible through the support of our coaches and stake holders. I would like to thank all the coaches that took part in this and made it a success, I would also like to say a special thanks to our "Touch Pals "who assisted our coaches.

This year we provided 39 coaches for 34 teams, over 4 tournaments from our own tournament, the Tamariki classic, Youth Nationals and onto the Masters and Opens tournaments. Again, our province
