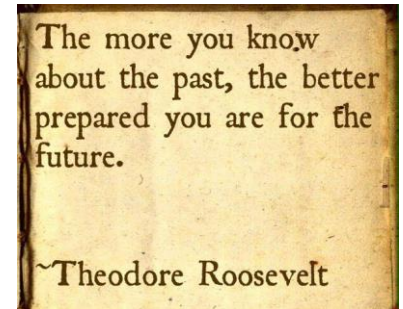
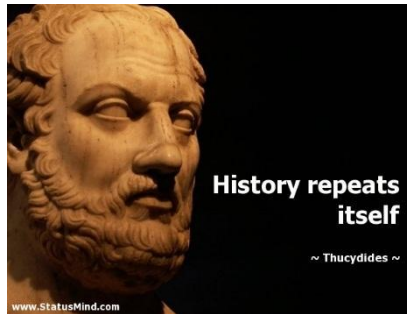

## What will I learn and how will I learn?

This course focuses on developing your research and interpretive skills. This then enables you to develop the ability to examine and argue from an historian's point of view. It teaches most useful skills for use at university and in other school subjects. The course uses a topic approach. They will learn:

- how to write confidently in a range of styles to express their ideas.
- how to explore and articulate their ideas both in written and verbal work.
- how to closely read, analyse and interpret cartoons, sketches, pictures, and texts.
- how to use processes and structures to understand and respond to surface level and deeper ideas within texts.

Opportunities for travel to history competitions, museums, and places of historical significance may be available.

## Entry Criteria

This is open. However, a "reasonable degree" of literacy is required to succeed.

## Conditions of Assessment

Two internals are "open" assessments. The third has some degree of in-class compulsory work as a requirement.

## Submitting Internal Assessment

Achievement Standard 91434 - in a folder; Achievement Standards 91435 and 91437 - electronically.

## Resubmission and Further Assessment Opportunities

Resubmissions can only be offered once and only when small errors or omissions need to be corrected in your work in a short period of time. There is no further teaching available.

For selected pupils who have gained UE Literacy in Year 12, there is an opportunity to sit a first year University paper studying the topic American History.
