

AGM Recommendations

The Executive Committee recommends the trial introduction during the 2023/24 year of an annual Club Scorecard to reflect each Club's contribution to the sport and to the activities of the Association.

Background Notes.

The Executive Committee is proposing the scorecard as a way to provide motivation for Clubs to "up their game" to benefit the sport, their Club and activities of the Association. Information compiled for the past year is shown below. Some categories are expressed as a %age of the membership and for others the Executive Committee has also applied a weighting reflecting the value that these contributors bring to the sport e.g. referees, coaches and tournament managers. The scorecard will help Clubs to see what categories they could focus their attention on in the coming season to improve their overall score. A copy of the scorecard spreadsheet and the supporting worksheets will be provided to Clubs for their information.

Notes:

1. A weighting of 5 has been applied to Executive Committee members, Coaches and to Referees in recognition of their contribution.
2. Weightings of 2, 4, & 6 have been applied to Assistant Managers, Tournament Managers and Senior Tournament Managers reflecting the complexity and duration of the respective roles.
3. The WCA is proposing to hold annual/biannual Tournament Manager training sessions to assist people to get to grips with their responsibilities.

A copy of the scorecard will be distributed in advance of the 2024 AGM. Should the AGM agree that the concept be continued then it is the intent of the Executive Committee that the two Clubs with the best scores in subsequent years will receive a financial reward for their efforts by way of a %age refund of regional levies paid in that year. Possibly 20% for the winner and 10% for the runner-up. A combined figure of around \$250.
